
Our Mission

The mission of Family Promise of Wayne County is to help homeless and low-income families achieve sustainable self-reliance through a non-governmental, non-denominational community-based response. Specifically, we enlist and coordinate congregations and service organizations in Wayne County to provide large numbers of volunteers to shelter (in churches' buildings) and feed homeless families. We then use our own professionals to assist in finding relevant services and in job placement.



The Need

The McInney-Vento Act requires that school districts document and report instances of school-aged homelessness. The map below shows numbers of children reported under the Act by the school district named along with a statistical factor to account for additional children who are pre-school. Based on the data reported there is a consistent county-wide number of more than 600 children and their parents annually that lack permanent housing.



How We Function

The simplified graphic below depicts how services are provided to homeless families admitted into the Family Promise program:



How will our program be accessed?

Family Promise guest families are referred through a variety of existing resources in the county.

Family Promise of Wayne County has already established close relationships with many of the

churches in the county which are points of referral. We are also known to school counseling offices in every school district and have been systematically meeting with various Social Service organizations in the county such as Green Angels, Wayne County Action Program, Legal Assistance of Western NY, Lions and Rotary service clubs, Victim Resource Center, Youth Advocacy Program, Family Counseling Service, Thriving Families Program (TFP). Through close cooperation with these and other Wayne County organizations families are appropriately referred to Family Promise.

Our Daycenter

Family Promise is excited to announce that Lyons will be the location of our Daycenter. Thanks to the gracious hospitality of the First Presbyterian Church of Lyons, we will have access to their manse for use as the Family Promise Daycenter for the foreseeable future. This development is so very important because the Daycenter is the hub of many important activities associated with support to our guests. The Daycenter provides:

- 1. The office and operating location for our Executive Director
- 2. Case management offices
- 3. The place where guests go each day for:
 - a. Liaison to existing Social Services.
 - b. Skills development
 - c. Job hunting
 - d. Guidance from our case manager
 - e. Support for preschool children
 - f. Showers and personal care



And, of course, with the Daycenter being located in Lyons just a few blocks away from the Wayne County Department of Social Services our guests will be in close proximity to existing support and services that they will be accessing along the way.

How Can I Help?

1. Volunteer!

There is no more important way you can help Family Promise than by volunteering your expertise in support of one or more of the ongoing activities of the organization.

Family Promise of Wayne County relies on about 1500 volunteers to provide the services necessary to sustain families in crisis. While families are living in the network, volunteers have opportunities to provide assistance 365 days a year, 24 hours a day.

Volunteers who directly serve guests reduce program expenses through the gift of their time and or donations. They share meals and sometimes stay overnight. Volunteers plan and manage recreational activities, such as birthday parties, Holiday celebrations and sporting events. They tutor school age children.

Administrative volunteers assist the Board of Trustees on various committees necessary to keep the Network functioning. These committees include:

- Fundraising
- Finance
- Communications and Public relations
- Personne
- Congregation recruiting and relationships
- Transportation
- Day center oversight
- Operations/coordination

- f. Toddler booster seats with straps (for the table)
- g. Laundry detergent/Fabric Softener/Dryer sheets
- h. Lysol, room air fresheners
- i. Towels (New or gently used)
- j. Pillows (New only)
- k. Basic household items for families graduating from the programs cleaning supplies,
- I. kitchen items, laundry items, bedding items. Call for specifics.
- m. Swiffer mops and refills.
- n. Dust Busters
- o. Flashlights and batteries
- p. Flash drives for computers
- q. Laptop Computers for our students
- r. Heavy duty paper plates: dinner and dessert size (no styrofoam)
- s. Paper Goods: Paper towels, napkins, hot & cold cups
- t. Aluminum foil, plastic storage bags, tall kitchen garbage bags
- u. Personal Hygiene Items (toothbrushes, toothpaste, body lotion, body wash, feminine hygiene products etc.)
- v. Men's Toiletries (razors, shaving cream, deodorant, body wash, etc.)
- w. Baby Essentials (lotions, body wash, shampoo, diaper cream, bottles, wipes, etc.)
- x. Liquid hand soap (refill size)
- y. Twin-size air mattresses with pump

4. An Awesome Way To Support Family Promise...for Free!

As an authorized 501c3, Family Promise of Wayne County has registered with Amazon as a designated charity under their Smile program.

What is Amazon Smile? It's very simple. As a philanthropic act, Amazon will donate 0.5% of the value of your purchases to Family Promise of Wayne County (FPWC). To benefit from this program you and I have to do only 2 things:

- 1. Designate Family Promise of Wayne County as your charity of choice. Click <u>HERE</u> to do so.
- 2. Shop at "smile.amazon.com" instead of "amazon.com". There is no difference in availability of items nor in prices.

Question: Half of one percent doesn't seem like much. Is it really worth it?

Answer: Let's assume we can persuade 500 people both within and outside of Wayne County to designate FPWC with Amazon Smile. And further, let's say that, on average, each one spends \$50/month on Amazon. Here are the numbers:

- 1. 500 people x \$50 in purchases = \$25,000 per month.
- 2. $0.005 \times $25,000 = $125 \text{ per month contributed by Amazon to FPWC!}$

3. $$125 \times 12 = $1,500 \text{ per year.}$

Which would be a wonderful benefit, yes; BUT I'm suggesting that we can probably spread the word to enlist MORE than 500 and that the average monthly spend could well be in excess of \$50. This one small program could bring multiple thousands of dollars to FPWC each year.

Please click <u>HERE</u> to designate FPWC as your charity of choice and **spread the word to your friends and family** and ask them to do the same (and to spread the word to THEIR friends and so on). Then just shop normally at <u>smile.amazon.com</u>!!
